

LAWS OF NEW YORK, 1977
CHAPTER 427

AN ACT to authorize central school district number, one, towns of Haverstraw and Stony Point, Rockland county and towns of Woodbury, Tuxedo, and Highlands, Orange county, to establish a public library known as Haverstraw Kings Daughters Public Library as a public library for the area within said school district

Became a law July 12, 1977, with the approval of the Governor. Passed by a majority vote, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or local law to the contrary, the central school district number one, towns of Haverstraw and Stony Point, Rockland county and Woodbury, Tuxedo and Highlands, Orange county, is hereby authorized by action of a majority of its electors residing within the area in the town of Haverstraw bounded and described as follows: Beginning at a point, on the westerly shore of the Hudson River, it being the point formed by the intersection of the westerly shore of the Hudson River with the southerly boundary of the Town of Haverstraw, said line being also the southerly boundary of the Village of Haverstraw and the northerly boundary of the Town of Clarkstown, thence running in a westerly direction along the southerly line of the Town of Haverstraw to its intersection with the westerly boundary of the North Rockland Central School District, thence following the westerly boundary of the North Rockland Central School District as it winds and turns in a northwesterly direction to a point formed by the intersection of the southeasterly boundary line of Orange County and the westerly boundary of the North Rockland Central School District, thence in a northeasterly direction along the boundary line separating Orange County from Rockland County to its intersection with the northerly boundary of the Town of Haverstraw, thence in an easterly direction along the northerly boundary of the Town of Haverstraw, said line also forming the southerly boundary of the Town of Stony Point, as it winds and turns, to a point formed by the intersection of said line with the westerly shore of the Hudson River, thence running in a southerly direction along the westerly shore of the Hudson River as it winds and turns to the point or place of beginning to establish a public library to be known as Haverstraw Kings Daughters Public Library with or without branches for the above described portion of the aforesaid central school district, and such central school district is hereby authorized to raise money by tax, to equip and maintain such library or libraries and to provide a building or rooms for its or their use. Such tax shall be a charge upon the taxable property of that part of the central school district described above. Such school district is hereby authorized to acquire real or personal property for the purposes of such library or libraries by gift, grant, devise, bequest or condemnation. The board of trustees of the said Haverstraw Kings Daughters Public Library shall administer the affairs of such library or libraries in accordance with the provisions of the education law under the charter heretofore granted to it by the board of regents of the state of New York. Except as otherwise provided by this act, the provisions of the education law relating to public libraries shall be applicable to the public library or libraries re-established and continued in pursuance of this act.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
