NYS Legislation and School Librarians – 2019 Session

A.2444/S.2421 - Equal Access to School Libraries & Librarians - Current law fails to protect New York student rights to sound instruction in information sciences. 36% of primary and 26% of secondary schools have no school librarian. Studies in information fluency prepare students for college success, enhance career opportunities, and foster community engagement. This legislation provides a long-overdue guarantee that all students have access to a quality school library staffed by a certified NYS School Library Media Specialist. (2019 NYLA Legislative Priority)
