**Historical Note:**

The Rome-Turney Radiator Company was founded in 1905 in Rome, New York, by Joseph B. Long and George Turney under the name Long-Turney Radiator Company. Initially the company manufactured automobile radiators using the machinery Joseph Long patented. Long and Turney parted ways in 1908 when Turney acquired the rights to make radiators using the method patented by General Electric in Schenectady, New York. After the partnership was dissolved, the company was named the Rome-Turney Radiator Company.

When the automobile industry was in its infancy, radiators were manufactured by independent companies. However, in the early 1920s, automobile companies began to produce their own radiators. Consequently, the Rome-Turney Radiator Company began to manufacture radiators for furnaces for private homes and commercial buildings. It was also at this time the company was purchased by William Lynch, Sr., who was one of the first employees hired by George Turney when the company began. Under Lynch's leadership, the company ceased production of automobile radiators by the early 1930s and only manufactured radiators for furnaces for homes and commercial buildings.

**Scope and Content Note:**

The collection consists of photographs of radiator units and parts used for furnaces manufactured by the Rome-Turney Company. Most of the photographs are of interior spaces in private homes, businesses and other public spaces with the radiator units being the focal point of the image. There are also some photographs showing the exterior of buildings that were equipped with furnaces manufactured by the Rome-Turney Company. It is believed that the photographs were taken in the 1930s. The majority of the photographs contain names of buildings or the names of residents, location, photographer and the names of architects and heating contractors. Most of the photographs are numbered, which aids in identifying the duplicate photographs found in the collection.

The photographs originally were bound together in seven albums that were probably compiled by Rome-Turney Radiator Company. Each item was removed from the album and placed in a separate folder in the same order as it was found in the album. The exact order of the albums as a whole was not known, so this institution identified them as follows:

Album "C"	Photographs of radiators in finished rooms (Boxes 3 and 4, 52 photographs)
Album "D"	Photographs showing the exterior of buildings that used radiators manufactured by Rome-Turney Company with some photographs of interior rooms (Box 5, 47 photographs)
Album "E"	Photographs of radiators and various components of a radiator as well as the process of designing and constructing radiators (Box 6, 42 photographs)
Album "F"	Photographs of hot water heaters and the Roblast radiator unit with a photograph of the construction process and one photograph of a finished radiator unit (Box 7, 42 photographs)
"Folio Album"	Photographs of radiators in finished rooms (Boxes 8-10, 19 photographs)

The purpose of Albums "A" through "F" is unknown; however it is possible that these were used for sales purposes or as a portfolio of the company's products and projects. The "Folio Album" was a part of the Rome-Turney's display at the 1939 World's Fair held in Flushing Meadows, New York. Many of the enlarged photographs in this album can be found in other albums of the collection. The collection includes a certificate given to the company by the fair's board of directors certifying the company's participation in the fair (Box 8, Folder 1).
