





NOVELNY offers free statewide access to an encyclopedia, strong general reference and periodicals content, business, news and health concentrations, and an interface and content for young people in grades K through 12. These databases are freely **available to all New Yorkers** directly from the State Library or via some 5,600 public, school, academic and special libraries:

State employees can access the databases through the [State Library website](#). Many of the databases are now available through geoIP authentication (also referred to as geolocation). Geolocation is a method to allow or disallow a user access to a database based on his/her geographic location as determined from their IP address. If you are recognized as being in New York State you will not have to enter your New York State Library P card and PIN. At this time Grolier Online and Gannett Newsstand Complete still require a New York State Library P card and PIN, but geolocation for these databases should be available soon.

Change in Library Hours

Effective September 3, 2013, the New York State Library will open at 9:30 a.m. (instead of 9 a.m.) Monday through Friday. This change will allow the Office of Cultural Education to have a uniform start time for the State Library, the State Museum and the State Archives. It will also give the State Library consistent hours (9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.) Monday through Saturday. Please note that reference services by telephone or internet will still be available beginning at 9 a.m. on weekdays.
