



Talking Book Services for Library Patrons

Your library patrons who are having difficulty reading standard or large print books may be eligible for FREE Talking Book services through the State Library and the National Library Service network. **In the 55 counties of upstate NY, this service is provided by the New York State Talking Book and Braille Library (TBBL) located in Albany, NY.** Individuals are eligible for service from TBBL if they have a visual impairment, a physical disability, or a diagnosed reading or learning disability.

TBBL has thousands of fiction and non-fiction titles in audio format, as well as a large collection of children's and adult Braille books, including Braille downloads. The complete digital collection can be downloaded. Over 70 magazines are also available to eligible borrowers. Registered borrowers are loaned special playback equipment free of charge, and the popular BARD mobile app makes it possible to play downloaded books on iOS, Android and Kindle Fire devices.

Registered borrowers may access thousands of downloadable books through BARD (Braille and Audio Reading Download) service. **Public libraries may also register for Talking Book services and BARD.**
