Troy, West Troy. 1826

The packet boat Marguis De La Fayette,
having arrived at the Rensselaer School last
evening, the students and hands devoted the
day to preparing the boat for commencing
lodging, carrying baggage, provisions &c.
At fifteen minutes before 11 A.M. we set
off. We passed Troy and looked up to West
Troy. We commenced our journey in the ca-
anal at 15 minutes before 12 o'clock P.M.
Besides the captain and three hands, the fol-
lowing young gentlemen embarked, ~~with~~
as members of the expedition.
